

THE IMPACT OF THE MINING INDUSTRIES ON THE ECONOMY OF THE UNITED STATES

- ⤵ In 1998, the mining industries, as a source of income flows, had a combined direct and indirect impact on the economy of the United States of **\$491.768 Billion**
- ⤵ Including combined direct and indirect contributions of
 - \$112.068 Billion** in personal income (equal to 3 million jobs)
 - \$322.573 Billion** in business income
 - \$31.815 Billion** in federal government revenues and
 - \$25.312 Billion** in state and local government revenues
- ⤵ As a result of the circulation (and multiplication) of the mining industries' total direct impact of **\$50.992 Billion**
- ⤵ That included direct payments of
 - \$4.124 Billion** to state and local government
 - \$3.974 Billion** to the federal government
 - \$26.108 Billion** to other American businesses and
 - \$16.786 Billion** in personal income for Americans, including wages and salaries for the industries
- ⤵ Who labored to produce minerals with a total value of **\$60.799 Billion**

In Comparison, In 2001, The Estimated Direct And Indirect Economic Impact Of Mining Due To

- ✓ Missouri's Personal Income was **\$2.721 Billion**
- ✓ Missouri's Business Income was **\$6.583 Billion**
- ✓ State/Local Government Revenues was **\$458 Million**
- ✓ Federal Government Funds was **\$725 Million**
- ✓ For a total of **\$10.486 Billion**
